COURSE OVERVIEW:

The Miami Police Training Center is conducting a 1-hour training session on a short and concise history of the State Long Term Care Ombudsman Program, it's role in advocating for the 170,000 residents in nursing homes, assisted living facilities, and adult family care homes, through the investigation of complaints and the annual facility assessment process as directed by federal and state statute.

Dialogue is encouraged through the discussion of experiences in the field encompassing the Baker Act, financial exploitation investigations, and facility administrators refusing entry to a facility, and the calling of law enforcement seeking removal Ombudsmen for the premises.

Finally, how the programs outreach to law enforcement might be a benefit to the residents and the community at large.

This session will be beneficial to Elder Abuse Investigators.
