Workplace Violence: What Law Enforcement Needs to Know

Instructor:

J. Branch Walton is employed by the Miami Police Training Center and is also Associate Dean of Student Services at Henley Putnam University. He retired from the U. S. Secret Service after 21 years serving on three Presidential details and retiring as a field Office Special Agent in Charge. Mr. Walton's other employment included stints as Director of Corporate Security for Cummins Engine Company, faculty at Indiana University, Division Chief at the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC), also Ft Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport, and as a training consultant for several Homeland Security funded programs. He has authored many articles, books and videos on subject matter in his area of expertise. As recently as this year he was called upon to instruct a Federal agency on this subject following a fatal incident in California.

COURSE OVERVIEW:

This one day course includes a discussion of common types of revenge committed by disgruntled employees, ex-employees and customers. What management can do about the employee who commits acts of harassment, intimidation or aggression. How officers can reduce workplace violence in their own department and their community.

- The causes of incidents of revenge
- Pre-incident indicators
- Threat assessments
- The differences between aggression and assertion
- Predicting violent behavior

Method of instruction includes lecture, group discussion and exercises. Training is supported by the use of Power Point presentation, videos, audios and case studies.
