Subject: PACKAGES STOLEN



Miami Police Burglary Detectives are investigating the theft of packages that had been delivered to 3101 N.W. 4 Street on December 5, 2019.

According to detectives, on December 5, 2019 the victim was supposed to receive several packages via U.S.P.S. On December 6, 2019 the victim had not received the packages so she reviewed her surveillance system video. The victim observed that the packages were delivered on December 5, 2019 at approximately 1:13 p.m. by U.S.P.S.

At approximately 3:00 p.m. the surveillance footage shows a gray 4 door vehicle park on the roadway in front of the victim's house. A suspect is then seen walking onto the victim's front yard and continue to her porch area. The suspect then picks up the packages, walks back to the car, and tosses them through the passenger front window of the car. The suspect continues to the driver's side and drives away.

The packages contained Christmas Family Photo Cards and miscellaneous items valued at over \$200.00.

Just seconds later, the suspect and the vehicle are captured by another surveillance as he takes another package from another house.

Burglary Detectives need your assistance in identifying the suspect as the investigation continues.

Suspect: White, male, 30 to 45 years old, with tattoos on both forearms and both lower legs. He was last seen wearing a black and gray t-shirt, gray shorts with red underwear showing, and black flip-flops.

Vehicle: A 4 door, gray sedan, with a sunroof and silver colored rims.
