Subject: ARMED ROBBERY

Detectives are investigating an armed robbery that occurred at approximately 5:00 a.m. on June 18, 2019, at 503 N.W. 12 Avenue.

The victim was opening Ela's Bakery Cafe when he was asked in Spanish, "What time is it?" As the victim turned around, he saw one of the suspects who was sitting in the front passenger side of the car pointing a handgun at him. Another suspect in the rear seat exited with a revolver in hand and demanded his money and keys. The victim gave them his wallet but not the keys. As the suspect ran back to the car, the victim still fearing for his life pulled out his own handgun and shot several rounds at the suspects. The suspects fled northbound on 12 Avenue in the dark colored, 4 door sedan.

The investigation continues as detectives are actively working the case and are in search of:

Subject #1: light complexion Hispanic male, 18 to 20 y.o.a., approximately 150 lbs, clean shaven, last seen wearing a dark hoodie, and armed with a silver revolver.

Subject #2: medium complexion Hispanic male, 18 to 20 y.o.a., approximately 130 lbs, 5'06", and armed with a black revolver.

Subject #3: black male, 22 to 25 y.o.a., armed with a black revolver.

Subject #4: No description on driver.

Vehicle: dark colored, early 2000's, 4 door sedan.

These suspects could possibly be involved in other robberies and are considered armed and dangerous.
