STABBING LEAVES ONE CRITICALLY WOUNDED

The Miami Police Department's Assaults Unit is investigating a stabbing that took place on Tuesday, April 28, 2020, at approximately 3:07 a.m., in front of 1800 W. Flagler Street.

According to detectives, three Hispanic adult males were involved in a verbal dispute amongst each other, at which point in time a physical altercation ensued where one offender began punching the victim, striking him several times, while the other continuously stabbed the victim with a knife. Once officers arrived on scene, they located a Hispanic male lying on the ground who appeared to have been suffering from several apparent stab wounds to his chest area.

Miami Fire Rescue responded and transported the victim to Jackson Memorial Ryder Trauma Center in critical condition.

Moments later, as officers began to canvass, one of the two offenders, positively identified by a witness was located with blood residue on parts of his body. The subject was detained at N.W. 16th Avenue and West Flagler Street for further investigation.

Miami Police Assaults Detectives have since arrested and charged Marvin Alvarez, D.O.B. 07/30/1986 with one count of Battery. See attached Arrest Affidavit.

The co-defendant responsible for the stabbing remains at large.

Detectives are looking for:

<u>Suspect 2</u>: Unknown White Hispanic male. Last seen wearing a white tank-top and dark colored shorts.

Detectives need your assistance after exhausting leads regarding this investigation.
