## Subject: TWO ARMED MEN TAKEN INTO CUSTODY AFTER POINTING FIREARMS AT CITY OF MIAMI POLICE DETECTIVES

Two individuals have been safely taken into custody and charged with multiple offenses after they exited a silver Nissan Maxima and pointed firearms at City of Miami Police Detectives who were conducting surveillance in the area of Gibson Park. The suspects, identified as Markeem Donald Curry and Shyquaveon Antauris Davis, now face charges including Aggravated Assault, Unlawful Display of a Firearm While Committing a Felony, and Improper Exhibition of a Firearm with Prejudice.

The incident unfolded as City of Miami Police Detectives were actively involved in surveillance operations near Gibson Park. Detectives observed a silver Nissan Maxima on NW 2 Avenue and 13 Street. Shortly after, the two armed men emerged from the vehicle, brandishing their weapons and directly threatening the detectives. In response, the vigilant detectives tactically retreated to a secure position.

Recognizing the imminent danger posed to the officers and the community, additional City of Miami Police resources were rapidly deployed to the scene. With utmost professionalism and adherence to protocol, law enforcement personnel swiftly apprehended the suspects without incident.

Chief Manny Morales praised the decisive, swift, and intelligent actions of the officers involved, stating, "If not for the quick thinking and professionalism displayed by our law enforcement personnel, this incident could have had dire consequences. The safety of our officers and the community is our highest priority, and we will continue to work diligently to maintain a secure environment for all."

Markeem Donald Curry and Shyquaveon Antauris Davis are now in custody and will face the full extent of the law for their alleged crimes. The City of Miami Police Department expresses gratitude to all officers involved in the successful resolution of this potentially dangerous broad daylight situation.
