ARREST MADE IN SEXUAL BATTERY CASE

The City of Miami Police Department Special Victims Unit arrested <u>Mike Kevin Jacques</u>, <u>D.O.B. 11/18/1998</u>, for his involvement in a violent sexual assault case that occurred yesterday, October 30, 2023, in the area of 7600 North Miami Avenue.

According to the 29-year-old female victim, at approximately 5:30 a.m., while she was taking out her trash, the suspect approached her from behind, grabbed her by her hair and forcefully dragged her away from her residence, and into a parking lot where he proceeded to remove her clothing and sexually assaulted her. The victim continued to fight the suspect off until she managed to break free and run for help. She eventually located and flagged down an off-duty Miami Police Officer at the intersection of North Miami Avenue and 77th Street.

Special Victims Detectives immediately began their investigation, obtained her statement, and reviewed surveillance footage from the area which corroborated the details given by the victim. Through investigative leads provided by the Special Victims Unit Detectives, members from the Tactical Robbery Unit located the suspect operating a white BMW X3, at which point they conducted a felony traffic stop and ultimately transported him to Miami Police Headquarters Special Victims Office after a positive identification of the suspect was made by the victim.

The suspect has since been charged with one count each of **Sexual Battery**, **Kidnapping**, **Burglary/Occupied Structure** and **Battery**. Please see the attached redacted Arrest Affidavit.

The victim, whose identity is being withheld for her privacy and protection, displayed immense courage in coming forward to report the crime. Detectives believe there may be additional victims and are encouraging them to come forward to report the crime.
