Subject: **ARREST MADE IN SEXUAL BATTERY AND CHILD
EXPLOITATION INVESTIGATION**

The City of Miami Police Department's Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force has arrested **Osher Joshua Pittman** (D.O.B. 04/16/2004) for **sexual battery on a minor** and **possession of child sexual abuse material**.

On **May 19, 2025**, ICAC detectives interviewed a juvenile female victim following a reported incident of sexual battery. The victim disclosed that while she was at the suspect's residence, she was in the living room when the suspect inappropriately touched her. At the time of the incident, the victim's mother was reportedly in another room.

On **August 18, 2025**, detectives received a cyber tip regarding the online upload of child sexual abuse material. As a result, a residential search warrant was executed at the suspect's residence, where electronic devices belonging to the suspect were located and found to contain child sexual abuse material.

Following the investigation, the suspect was taken into custody and interviewed by detectives. He has since been arrested and charged with the following:

- **Fifteen (15) counts** of *Possession of Sexual Performance by a Child*
- **One (1) count** of *Engaging in Sexual Conduct with Animals/Images*
- **One (1) count** of *Sexual Battery on a Minor*

Through meticulous investigative work, detectives were able to successfully bring a perpetrator of such despicable acts to justice and therefore prevent further harm to innocent children.

The Miami Police Department will always remain steadfast in its commitment to combatting crimes against children. We urge our community to report any suspicious activities or information related to child sexual abuse.
