### **The City of Miami Police Department and Uber Eats Announce Free Meals for City of Miami Residents.**

Uber, alongside Miami Police Chief Jorge Colina and the City of Miami Police Department, today announced a partnership to provide additional support through free Uber Eats meal vouchers to Miami residents during the COVID-19 pandemic. Uber Eats has donated \$25,000 in Uber Eats Vouchers for families who are in need of a meal in the City of Miami. The vouchers, which have a \$25 value, can be redeemed for a free meal from any restaurant on the Uber Eats App in the City of Miami.

Javi Correoso, Public Affairs, Uber said;
